ARREST MADE IN OTTER AVENUE INCIDENT

On Thursday, May 19, 2011 at approximately midnight, the Salem Police Department responded to a call of shots being fired in the area of the 100 block of Otter Avenue. Upon arrival, officers spoke with the female complainant who told them that two men knocked on her apartment door. Once she answered the door, one of the suspects raised a handgun and fired several rounds into the front door of the residence, but no one was injured.

The two suspects, described as black males in their late teens wearing white shirts and blue jeans, then fled from the scene on foot.

That same day at approximately 3pm, one of the suspects, Terrance Devon Pannell of Roanoke, was taken into custody by the Roanoke City Police Department and charged with the following crimes related to this incident:

- **Use of a Firearm in the Commission of a Felony**
- **Attempted Malicious Wounding**
- **Discharge Firearm within City Limits**
- **Obstruction of Justice.**

Pannell is now being held without bond in the Roanoke County-Salem jail.
